#### Cleveland Metro Ski Council will be heading to the larges ski area in the WORLD!

We will be staying in Meribel and a ski in ski out hotel in the heart of Les 3 Vallées (The 3 Valleys) offers the highest number of interconnected runs open in Europe.

I skied the 3 valleys many several years ago and the area was fantastic and you ski from town to town. An uncontested and unparalleled international reputation! Both vertically and horizontally, the expanse of ski area is a dream come true for even the most insatiable skiers. The stats alone give you the measure of this incredible playground: 12.5 miles as the crow flies between Courchevel and Orelle, and 373 miles over a network of more than 3,707 acres of ski runs make up the ski area. That means you could fit the five largest ski areas in the United States into Les 3 Vallées ski area alone!





In Malta they have some of the oldest man made structures in the world and the sight we visited dated back to before the time of the Great Pyramids. This sight dated back to around 3400 BC.


















#### SNOWBALLERS SKI CLUB WINS COMBINED RACE TEAM TROPHY

February 18-19, 2023. Bristol Mountain, NY. Combined Race Weekend is the showcase weekend in the CMSC Adult Race Schedule, featuring three race disciplines. The Extra Long Giant Slalom and Giant Slalom races took place on Saturday, and the Slalom race was held Sunday. Clubs competed for the overall team trophy and individuals competed for individual class honors. It's a big deal.

Snowballers Ski Club dominated the weekend by winning the Team Combined Trophy for Division 1 over Fagowees Ski Club, 718 points to 632. Out of eleven race classes, Snowballers won seven individual combined trophies. Erie Shore Ski Club won the Division 2 title with 186 points, Continental Ski Club placed second with 142 points and Hi Rise Ski Club placed third with 30 points. Points are given to each racer based on his or her finish for each race. First place gets 15 points, second 12 points, third 10 points, etc. Those points are added together to get the team point totals.

**2023 Individual Combined Winners**: Winning the individual combined trophy is an achievement. There are twelve race classes, and eleven of those twelve had combined winners. The winner must complete all five race runs beating the competitors in their class in the least amount of time. The times for all five runs are "combined" together, and the racer with the least amount of time wins the Individual Combined Trophy. This is not an easy thing to do. It takes focus, discipline and not celebrating too much on Saturday night.

A few travelers arrived to Val D'Isere via their own routes and I am certain we can all agree that the journey was well worth it.





Our hotel was in the heart of town and we were able to walk to many different stores and restaurants. The daily trek to the mountain was a mere 1/4 mile walk. Yes, it was a bit of a pain in ski boots and we all managed to do it.

Major storms bring blue bird powder days

The Chagrin Valley Ski Club went to Lake Tahoe in early March 2023. This was an adventure, we knew the Sierras had a lot of snow, but did not think much of it. The weather and other delays kept us from arriving at our hotel until midnight following a 21-hour journey. On top of it United Airlines did not load all of our luggage and some of us were missing at least one bag. Those bags arrived in the evening of the next day. Once arriving one of our group felt a bit tipsy and accidentally slipped into the hot tub.

Did they have a lot of snow? You bet. You've seen the pictures of Lake Tahoe this winter and they are not an



exaggeration. The heavy snow the day we arrived closed the resort the next day. They had to dig out the lifts. So we spent our time sightseeing the quaint village, shopped at the grocery store, had fun in casinos, or took in the movie *Cocaine Bear*. It was the perfect film to see when the lifts close. It was right up there with *Snow Shark*. It has an excellent chomp factor.

Our gear arrived Sunday evening and we heard the slopes would open the next day. The wait was worth it because we experienced a perfect blue-bird powder day. We had calf-deep powder on the groomed runs and waist-deep pow off-piste in the trees.

Once on the slopes the skiing was among the best we have ever done. We took a lunch break at the Sky Deck but if you wanted to sit at an outside table you needed to dig it out of the snow with a tray. I'm not kidding.

The next day we hoped to do a day at Kirk-wood. However, the road there was closed so we skied another day at Heavenly. Did I say this trip was an adventure? It was, but it also demanded us to be resilient and adaptable. The gondola was not working and there was no shuttle to the Nevada lifts. We caught a shuttle



to the California Lodge from which we could access the entire mountain.

Next day some folks took a break, some went skiing again at Heavenly, some went snowmobiling, and a group of us had cars so we headed up to Northstar. The drive there was very snowy but beautifully clear on the way back. The sky cleared up upon our arrival. The slopes again treated us with another blue-bird powder day. This day, the pow was knee deep on the "groomed" runs and waist-deep again off-piste. Northstar is the Deer Valley of Lake Tahoe. It is definitely upscale. Vail has spared no expense in developing this resort. It is on the small side though. It would be good for two days' worth of skiing and I would not want to spend a whole week there. It is also isolated from a town and casinos. Losing skis in the powder was a problem that day. We assisted one guy find his ski. However, if you could not find your ski some enterprising individual had a metal detector who could find your ski for you – probably for a fee.



The next day the atmospheric river approached and we had maybe a half-day's worth of skiing available to us. Once again, the gondola was closed. This time the resort was hunkering down for the coming storm, even going as far as taking chairs off one of the lifts. The storm predicted an additional 2 to 5 feet of snow in the upper elevations. The morning though, was absolutely stunning. One memorable run was Powderbowl Woods. It was a great tree run with class I and II moguls. Catch a video of it on our website. Off in the distance the run gave us beautiful views of the deep blue Lake Tahoe, necklaced by tall white pines with mountains beyond that.

At around noon the clouds started rolling in and that was our cue to get off the mountain. We learned shortly afterwards the resort told folks to get off and they formally closed the next day.

Meanwhile, about 25 people took a bus to go to Palisades that day. The storm began when they arrived and skiing there became a survival experience for everyone who went. One member got lost and had to be rescued by Ski Patrol. Another had to be rescued from deep snow (along with many others that day). Still another suffered a hairline leg fracture. By about 1 PM folks had had enough and wanted to go home. There were still some hardy folks on the slopes and others called and texted them to get off the slopes. The Palisade folks successfully made it home and immediately headed for happy hour.

The ski area closed our last day. Overall, we had four out of six possible days of skiing. We spent our last day hanging out, deepening our friendships, playing cards, drinking wine, and eating cheese. Contrary to our journey to Lake Tahoe I'm pleased to report the trip home was uneventful. We were only 13 minutes late arriving and all our bags showed up.

Heavenly, Palisades, and Northstar are wonderful resorts when the weather is good. The thing I love most about Heavenly are the trees. I'm glad I had some opportunity to enjoy them. The other big highlight was the bluebird powder days. They were days we dream about in October as the ski season approaches or eye longingly in the ski films. My biggest complaint is Heavenly's infrastructure. The gondola is notoriously unreliable and the transit system woefully inadequate. We had lackluster accommodations that showed their age. Two blocks away in Nevada the hotel accommodations (*i.e.*, the casinos) were luxurious. The only luxury accommodation at Heavenly-California is the Marriot, right next to the gondola. I imagine folks paying a premium to stay there felt disappointed they could not walk outside their door and hop on the gondola in the morning. Heavenly has a neglected feel about it. Maybe it is oppressive California building regulations that interfere with keeping the resort up to a world class standard. I would go back to Heavenly just for the skiing but not for the accommodations. Even then, keep your skiing expectations modest for the lifts might not be entirely working.
